EDUCATION 6503 – TEACHING MUSIC FROM THE (VIRTUAL) PODIUM

Instructors: Dr. David Buley and Dr. Andrea Rose

September - December, 2020

**Ed 6503** is one of a suite of **required** courses for the Music Education focus area – Masters in Curriculum, Teaching, and Learning Studies. This course may also be taken as an **elective** for other graduate programs such as Education and Music or as a stand-alone course for students not currently enrolled in a graduate program.

Ed 6503 is designed to study and enhance podium-based instruction in instrumental and choral ensemble settings. Specifically, it examines choral and instrumental music education in the context of 'comprehensive musicianship'. Through research and performance experiences, logical sequences for the acquisition of musical understandings and the development of skills are explored. Emphasis is placed on the nature of teaching and learning in ensemble settings; the construction of teacher/conductor identity on the podium; and, the development, implementation, and analysis of curriculum for conducted ensemble contexts.

The Fall 2020 edition of this course will include components that focus on values, skills, tools and resources related to ensemble-based music education in **virtual** settings. What can be taught and learned; how can students be supported and assessed in their learning (band, orchestra, choir)? How can we construct programs and plan for engaging and motivating students in virtual contexts?

All of MUN's Fall Semester courses are being offered remotely and/or online.
